The Junior League of Greater Elmira-Corning (JLGEC) to Host Diaper and Menstrual Product Giveaways to Those in Need

Elmira, NY - The Junior League of Greater Elmira-Corning is proud to announce it is committed to providing additional diapers and menstrual products for the Elmira and Corning communities this year. Last year, the group distributed an estimated 11,262 diapers and 350 menstrual product kits through a series of pop-ups across the Elmira community.

The JLGEC has scheduled two upcoming Diaper and Menstrual Product Giveaways:

- Monday, November 7th, 2022 from 4:00 to 6:00 PM, at the Economic Opportunity Program building located at 650 Baldwin Street, Elmira NY 14901
- Monday, January 9th, 2023 from 4:00 to 7:00 PM, at Family Services of Chemung County located at 1019 E. Water St. #3332, Elmira, NY 14901

This effort is important to JLGEC because it not only impacts individuals and families, but an entire community when caregivers can't go to work, or have health and dignity disparities due to a lack of access to basic hygienic supplies for themselves or their loved ones:

- As of 2022, New York State has a population of 898,536 under the age of three, with 20% of all families earning less than the federal poverty level. (National Diaper Bank Network)
- Most childcare facilities in New York State require parents to provide diapers for their child. Nationally, 57% of parents experiencing diaper need who rely on childcare reported they missed an average of four days of school or work in the past month because they didn't have diapers. (National Diaper Bank Network)
- Pads, tampons and menstrual cups are not covered by benefit programs such as SNAP, and some families are forced to cut back on these critical health maintenance items or prioritize other, equally critical purchases. (girlshelpinggirlsperiod.org)
- A 2021 study from U by Kotex showed that two in five people have struggled to purchase period products in their lifetime due to lack of income—a 35% increase from the menstrual hygiene brand's 2018 research.
